






Country of home university




Position at home university




Field of research






How many times did you apply for a Coimbra Group Scholarship?




Have you ever stayed at a foreign university before?



At which academic levels?




What were the main objectives of your stay?

Did you achieve these objectives?



Comments: main reason for the partial achievement of the objectives: the **duration of the scholarship was too short.**

"Stay was only one month."

"Time was not enough."

"Two-month stay was not enough to finish serious research."

"I stayed at the [university] for two months and collected the material for my research, but it was impossible to finish the research or even read all that material. Also, I attended some lectures, group meetings, conferences and made contacts."

"Because of limited time."

"My stay at the host university was too short, therefore I didn't have enough time to study all the sources I needed for my research."

"The stay was too short"

"Short time of 3 months is not enough to generate significant research outcome"


"It was necessary to provide a scholarship for at least two months"

"During my stay at the University of [...] I visited University of [...] and University of [...] to make contacts with potential partners. We submitted one project proposal to the Tempus in 2014, but unfortunately the area of expertise of these three universities did not match with the proposal."


How long did you stay at the host university?

"Further academic cooperation, valuable personal experience and preparation for the future and further research."


"Explore new research methods."

Was it easy to find a supervisor or contact person at the host university?




Comments:

"I did not know my supervisor personally before the application, but it was easy to find information about the research groups which work in the field that interests me on the webpage of the university."

"I contacted about 10 persons, and finally only one agreed, but I guess it was a matter of luck."

"It is important to be persistent. Professors are very busy, sometimes I had to wait for five days for a reply and I was confused waiting [for the] response."

What kind of problems?


*"I had problem with the **opening of a bank account and transferring my scholarship there**, because I am not an EU resident, and then special procedures should be applied. But staff from the International Office at [university] did their best to solve the problem."*

*"[Getting the] **visa**"*

*"After receiving the confirmation of receiving the scholarship, for a long time **couldn't contact anyone from the university**. Nobody answered my mails. This fact frustrated me [because] I needed some documents for my home university."*

*"**Accommodation** problems"*

Comments:

Non-financial support

"My **teaching load was planned for the second part of the academic year.** "

"My home university **recognized COIMBRA Group Scholarship as a very good opportunity for my future career in every possible way** (researching, teaching, doing joint projects, etc.). Some extra support I got from my Ph. D. supervisor."

"I only got a **letter of recommendation.**"

"[My home] university allowed [me] to use samples obtained there and allowed to **shift my working schedule.**"

"They supported me only in getting the **visa.**"

"My home university did not support my stay at the University [...] financially. CGHS programme covered costs of my stay in Granada and I covered travel cost by myself. However, I got support from home university in sense of **allowance for a few months absence**, as well as in sense of **support and approval of my research work** done in Granada, which was the base for future cooperation of the two universities, especially cooperation of my research teams from two universities."

"The authorities of the University were glad that I worked on my personal research [project]."

"My home university has supported only the necessary data."

Regular salary

"I could still get my **monthly salary** after having completed my teaching obligations to the university before leaving. But there was no other support of any kind."

No support

"It is my **personal research**, my colleagues from the home University are not involved in it."

"**Not only they didn't support my visit, they didn't even pay me my salary**, which was illegal."

"My home University **wasn't able to support me financially** (to cover my travel expenses, for instance)."

"I was in business trip **without financing from my University**."

"I didn't have any other grant or reimbursement."

"Unfortunately, Ukrainian universities **do not provide any additional support for mobility** of researchers outside [the country], because of financial issues."

"My home University **does not have funds** for such kind of stays."


"**Financially I had no support** except for the Coimbra scholarship."

"**They allowed me to go abroad, but were not too glad about this**. I had to go through a lot of bureaucratic formalities before going to [...]."

"**No financial support**."

"Because I was awarded with Coimbra Group Scholarship, my university [...] **stopped paying the monthly salary and fees for pension** in reimbursement fund, as well quitted my **health insurance** during the 3 month while I was stayed in [...]. The university's argument for those gestures was that the Macedonian law for University & High education does not allow to pay-off the salary for the researcher while the researcher gets a scholarship. It is a terrible condition. [...] I complained, but without any success. The university administration explained that Macedonian law for high education does not allow researchers to get paid leave."


What kind of impact do you think your stay at a Coimbra Group university will have?




Others:


How did you come to know about the Coimbra Group Scholarship Programme?




Would you be willing to become an ambassador or advisor for future Coimbra Group Scholars?
