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The CHARM-EU Alliance

- CHARM-EU is a *CHallenge-driven*, *Accessible*, *Research-based* and *Mobile* European University founded in 2019, currently comprising 9 universities from 8 countries.
- CHARM-EU partners work together to create a new university model enabling seamless mobility among students and staff, promoting excellence, mainstreaming inclusiveness, and contributing to the development of European higher education.
- CHARM-EU is creating challenge-driven, flexible, student-led educational programmes focused on identifying and solving challenges in collaboration with the broader community.
- The CHARM-EU programmes are focused on addressing the challenges of the 21st century and are aligned with European values, the European Green Deal and the UN SDGs
- CHARM-EU has created the first joint Master's Degree Programme under the criteria of the European Universities initiative: the Master's in Global Challenges for Sustainability.



 One of the main objectives of the CHARM-EU alliance is to expand and foster transferability, external cooperation, and partnerships, at all levels, local, national, European, and outside of Europe, including the Global South.

- Excellence, inclusion, diversity and democratic values are central focus points as a pre-condition to make long-term cooperation in a multicultural environment possible.

Academic partnerships

- During the first three years, CHARM-EU has transformation, transparency, and transferability at its core to act as a role model and example for other higher education institutions (CHARM-EU toolkit).
- Reinforce current strategic partnerships with relevant academic networks (CG, EUA, Unimed, Grupo Montevideo, etc) and with other European Universities Alliances (FOREU, legal entity, label degree)
- Tackling R&I foreign interference
- The role of universities as relevant agents in the international landscape (soft diplomacy, university autonomy and academic freedom)



Engagement with non-academic stakeholders

- The experience from our SwafS project (TORCH) has clearly shown us that engagement with (global) stakeholders requires time and resources (human and financial) and a continuous adjustment of expectations/ambitions from both sides.
- It is very important to understand what are their needs and how we can cooperate on a regular basis trying to integrate both educational and research activities (capstones, PhD, internships, continuous education) dynamic portfolio based on a bottom-up approach.
