

- Founded in 1985
- 39 Universities from 23 European countries
- >1,4M students
- >226 000 staff (teaching, research, admin.)
- The latest overview (2014), showed that in that year 36 000 students had undertaken Erasmus mobility to/from CG universities (16% of all Erasmus students in Europe)
- Multi-billion € total annual Research budget


