4EU+ Universities: profile

- Six large, comprehensive, public universities
- Similar characteristics
- Research-intensive institutions
- Alliance structured around long-lasting partnerships and numerous research collaborations (bottom-up links)





First lessons learnt

- 4EU+ Mission Statement goes beyond the pilot phase of "European Universities"
- Value of trust and openness
- Research and education inseparable
- Necessity of mutual interaction: "Europeanisation of 4EU+"
 - Bottom-up
 - Top-down



Europeanisation of 4EU+ universities





Challenges

- Different models of governance (top-down)
 - Embedding the 4EU+ governance structure into our Universities (more actors at more levels) different models
 - Accommodation of changes in the University governing bodies
- Initiation of faculties (bottom-up)
- Communication on horizontal and vertical level
- Sustainability



4EU+ Flagships: the story

- At the beginning of 2018 already existing or newly formed research teams formed 4 Flagships → autumn 2019 Erasmus+ call "European Universities" focus on education → educational aspect stressed, boosting synergies between research and education = the substance of Universities
- EU's support to the research dimension of "European Universities" important for balanced development



4EU+ Flagships

- Merging 4EU+ excellence in research and education
- Interdisciplinarity
- Research-based educational offerings





4EU+ Flagships: sustainability

- Key internal enablers: Seed funding supporting formation and widening and deepening of collaborating teams, ranging from research to research-based education activities developed bottom-up own sources
 - e.g. Charles University (twice 200K) and Warsaw University mini-grants (research with pedagogical outputs)
 - After Covid 19 ?
- Key external enablers:
 - EU funding schemes (Erasmus+, Horizon Europe or structural funds)
 - National co-financing



Impact of Covid - 19

- + all pre-planned activities, meetings, seminars took place online
- + the willingness to combine physical and online activities and learn from each other dramatically increased
- the finalization of 4EU+ governance slowed down
- - communication with APs differed



Conclusions

"Together, we aim to create a truly integrated European University System by 2025." - Mission Statement

4EU+ as a model of "differentiated integration"

- Deepening of integration on both levels within 4EU+
 - Governance
 - Academics, students, staff = authentic community ("European demos")
- Strengthening of integration and Europeanisation process in European Higher Education and Research Areas
- Outreach to society Jean Monnet's "spill-over effect"
